



The Parking Management System in Stuttgart

Throughout the city of Stuttgart, parking space has become scarce in many of its districts. This is why cars are often parked on pavements or in no-stopping or no-parking zones. Illegal parking on pavements puts pedestrians and other vulnerable groups at risk as it forces them to detour on to the road. It blocks critical lines of sight between motorists and pedestrians and obstructs the view of motorists at intersections and in curves. On their way to and from school, pupils, too, find it difficult to navigate among parked cars. Cruising for parking increases traffic congestion, pollution, and noise. Based on the successful implementation of the parking management system in many city districts, the new parking regulations are being introduced gradually in other city districts – giving priority to areas where the pressure for parking space has been proven to be particularly high.

Your benefits:

- Residents and visitors, businesses and customers find it easier to find a parking space.
- Illegal parking is minimized which thus helps improve traffic safety.
- There is less cruising for parking
- The residential and visiting conditions are improved.

What does parking management mean?

The parking management system is based on the so-called mixing principle, in other words, in principle parking space is available to anyone. However, for residents, if they are holders of a resident parking permit, the use is free of charge. Businesses have the option to apply for a special permit. All other motorists have to pay for parking time.

Who is eligible for a resident parking permit?

Residents who do not own nor rent a garage or parking space are eligible for a resident parking permit, if they own a car and have their registered main residence in one of the designated sub-zones.

To apply for your permit at a district citizens' centre [Bürgerbüro], you need:

- **a valid identity card;**
- **the motor vehicle registration certificate of your car** and – if you are not the car owner – a confirmation (e.g. issued by your employer) that you have permanent use of the vehicle. If you are a member of a car-pooling organization, please furnish written proof of your membership.

How much does a resident parking permit cost?

The annual administrative charge of the resident parking permit is € 30.70. This allows you to park in the residential parking zone indicated on your permit without having to purchase a prepaid parking voucher (except in the short-term parking zones).





Two different parking zones in the resident parking zone



P-Zone
Blue P
from parking meter

- Metered parking on weekdays between 8am and 10pm*
- In these zones resident permit holders can park at any time and free of charge
- Day ticket (valid up to 14 hours parking time, which is transferable to the following day)



Short term parking zone
Orange P
from parking meter

in areas with numerous businesses

- metered parking for residents and all other motorists, maximum stay limit: 2 hours
- metered parking on weekdays between 8am and 10pm*
- Monday to Friday free resident parking after 7pm (in Bad Cannstatt, Untertürkheim and Vaihingen after 6pm) and after 2pm on Saturday.
- free parking for residents and all other motorists on weekdays between 10pm and 8am, on Sunday and on public holidays

→ effective in the designated area only


→ metered parking and maximum stay limit for everyone!

→ residents are exempted from paying for parking time (effective as of hours stated on sign)

→ Exceptions in Bad Cannstatt, Untertürkheim and Vaihingen: 6pm

Special parking regulations effective for Stuttgart-City (centre)

Residents of the parking management zones Ci1, Ci2 or Ci3 do not fall within the scope of the afore mentioned regulation as they can park indefinitely in the city centre, if they are holders of a special permit. Metered parking is allowed for all other motorists in the city centre Monday to Saturday between 8am and 10pm for a maximum stay limit of one hour.



How much does a special permit cost?

There are two categories of special permits:

- „Small“ special permit (overnight parking), Monday to Saturday between 6pm and 8am the following day plus Sunday: free parking without parking ticket for an annual rate of € 150.00;
- „large“ special permit (24/7/365), unrestricted free parking for an annual rate of € 400.00.

Who is eligible for a special permit?

Residents, who have their registered main residence in the parking management zones Ci1, Ci2 or Ci3, who own a vehicle but do not own nor have a rental garage or parking space, are eligible for a special permit. To apply, you need:

- a valid identity card,
- the motor vehicle registration certificate of your car and – in case you are not the owner of the vehicle – a confirmation (e.g. issued by your employer) that the vehicle has been entrusted to you for permanent use,
- an informal written statement that you do not own nor have rented a garage nor a parking space.

Application procedure

Applications are made with the Public Safety Office [Amt für öffentliche Ordnung], road transport section, 5th floor, Eberhardstr. 37, 70173 Stuttgart.

Please note that district citizens' centres [Bürgerbüro] do not issue any special permits.
